

The A1 Online Greek Course

What is the A1 Online Greek Course?

The Erasmus+ Online Greek Course (OGC) is an online language learning program, that has been successfully running since 2014. It has been awarded with the “European Language Label 2016”.

- **Duration:** 6 weeks
- **Level:** A1 (absolute beginners)
- Prior knowledge: none
- **3 ECTS credits** (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System), if successfully completed.
- **Schedule:** autonomous learning + web-conferences, twice a week, lasting 45'

Why should I enroll in the A1 Online Greek Course?

1. You acquire basic communicative skills (level A1). You will be able to interact in Greek when you arrive in Thessaloniki and make the most of your stay in Greece.
2. You study on your own at home and you can easily adjust the course to your daily routine. The language course, however, has deadlines. There are fixed appointments for the web-conferences.
3. There is support by an instructor throughout the course. Autonomous learning does not mean learning without help.
4. The OGC is an easy and attractive way to learn Greek, through multi-media learning material (videos, sound recordings, quizzes, interactive graphics), posts at the forum, linguistic games and competitions.
5. Most online language learning programs mainly aim at developing listening and reading (comprehension). The OGC stands out, because it equally develops speaking and writing.
6. Upon the completion of the course, you can then directly enroll to the A2 regular Erasmus+ course, if you want. In this way, you maximize your linguistic competence, during the short period of Erasmus+. The A2 regular course, which takes place in a class, grants three (3) more ECTS credits, if successfully completed.

What are the main features of the A1 OGC?

The A1 OGC consists of eleven (11) units. Every unit includes:

- a. the communicative context and the relevant vocabulary with quizzes
- b. the grammar with exercises and quizzes
- c. a small preparatory task for the web-conference with your tutor and fellow students
- d. a small writing task or language game at the forum

You acquire a score for each unit. Assessment is based on: a) a progress test and a final test. b) the scores of the units, c) assessment of speaking and writing by your instructor.

Which are the technical requirements for the OGC?

- A desk-top PC or lap top
- An installed browser (Mozilla Firefox, Chrome, Safari)
- Camera, microphone, preferably headset or handsfree
- An internet Connection - Broadband (24Mbps is recommended)
- Your mail account

Which are my obligations, if I confirm my participation?

1. Every unit requires three hours of self-study. It is obligatory to work on each Unit and acquire a score for it.
2. The interactive online session lasts 45'. In small groups, you and your fellow students will have the opportunity to speak, ask questions and discuss the units you have already worked on.
3. The participation in the interactive sessions is obligatory. **Two (2) absences may be permitted.**
4. There is a progress test after the first five units and a final test after the completion of the course. It is obligatory to take part in both tests.
5. You get three (3) ECTS, if you work on all units, attend the online sessions, do your writing tasks and pass the midterm and final test.

2nd step: Receive our acceptance e-mail

3rd step: Three Taster days to familiarize with the online course

4th step: a. Send back to us the required documents (by email)

-copy of passport

5th step: Lessons start!
